Motorcyclist seeks first-, third-party benefits

Plaintiff suffers lower leg fractures that led to three surgeries; case is settled

Plaintiff Leonard Braund was driving his motorcycle on a two-lane road in northern Macomb County. He noticed that the semi truck that was two vehicles ahead of him partially hit a garbage can, sending the can up into the air. The car in front of the plaintiff then panicked, drove off of the road, and struck the can, which had landed. It was argued that, had the car maintained its position, the can would have fallen harmlessly to the side.

The force of the impact between the car and the can caused the can to be redirected

and fall directly in front of the plaintiff, causing him to crash the motorcycle. He suffered comminuted lower leg fractures that resulted in three surgeries.

Plaintiff maintained \$100,000 uninsured motorist coverage on his motorcycle, and asserted that the handling attorney knew that the "involvement" of a motor vehicle was enough to trigger firstparty no-fault benefits from the Michigan Assigned Claims Facility.

Both the first- and thirdparty cases settled for \$95,000 and \$150,000, respectively.
